This synthesis helps to not only evaluate what is already known but also highlight gaps where further investigation is required.

This is a Literature Review that requires deep synthesis rather than simple summary. Here, students organize themes from their bibliography, evaluate the strength of existing evidence, and propose implications for practice. It pushes learners to analyze trends in research, note contradictions, and position their own practice plan within the broader scholarly conversation. This ensures that solutions are informed, balanced, and aligned with the latest academic and clinical standards.

Developing Core Competencies in Nursing Education
